Greetings Bravo Brothers,

On behalf of the Bravo Board and the 2022 Bravo Reunion Committee, we are excited to have the Bravo Regulars return once again to Branson, Missouri.

The reunion will be held at the Radisson Hotel in Branson. For planning purposes, our reunion will begin Wednesday, June 1, and end Sunday, June 5, 2022. There will be a Hospitality Room open daily from 8:00 a.m. until the last Bravo Member has left the room. This is a time to enjoy shared memories or catch up on what has happened in your lives over the decades that have passed since Vietnam.

In the pages that follow, you will find a preliminary schedule of planned activities, along with a registration form for the 2022 Reunion. We would urge you to complete the registration form and make your hotel reservations at your earliest convenience. 

I hear the label 'Original' quite often. What does that mean? **Editor's response:** Ken, it refers to those of us who were with the 4th ID stateside and deployed with the division to RVN. The 4th ID was reactivated on 1 Jan. 66 at Fort Lewis, WA. While we went through Basic, AIT, and Guerilla Warfare training, a total of 8 months, the Division was built. We deployed together on 25 Sept. 66. Our Bravo Company took all the top honors during the first half of our training and was selected to be the Guerillas during the 4 months of that training, as well as Advance Party for the Brigade at deployment. We flew over and went to work while the others went by ship. This combination of events meant that we were much better trained and had a stronger sense of comradery than the replacements to follow or even the rest of the Brigade.

Donald E. Roberts, 68 (1st. Platoon—8/70-4/71)

Donald Roberts of Rantoul went to be with the Lord on October 24, 2018 at the VA Illiana Health Care System, Danville. He was born July 28,1950 in Portland, Oregon, a son of Carl and Betty Lou (Lippincott) Roberts. He married Brenda Severins on March 1, 1980, in St. Louis. She survives. Don graduated from Rantoul Township High School. He then entered the U.S. Army and served during Vietnam. He worked in the warehouse of Eisner, Eagle Wings, and then retired from Kraft. He enjoyed gardening, woodworking and showing dogs. He was a softball coach for many years and truly enjoyed spending time with his grandchildren.

Harold 'Bud' Muladore, 73 (3rd. Platoon—7/68-69)

Bud Muladore of Wilmington passed away unexpectedly on April 11, 2021. He was born on June 17, 1947 in Wilmington. Bud was a Vietnam veteran who served two tours of duty. He served with Bravo Company from 1968 to 1969 and then with 118th Battalion from 1969-1970 as a helicopter pilot and flew the Bandit 5. Bud retired from SAIC in 2014. He enjoyed playing golf, flying model planes, woodworking and spending time with his grandkids. He is survived by his wife of 46 years, Verda Baker Muladore.

Richard Thomas Linnemann, 78 (Commo—9/66-67 Original)

Richard passed away July 15, 2021 at his home in Alexandria, VA. Richard was born in Durham, NC on September 18, 1943, the third child of Calvin and Adelia Linnemann. He grew up in Burlington, NC, and graduated from Walter Williams High School. Richard continued his education at Duke University. He never lost his enjoyment of Duke football and basketball games. He signed up to go to the Vietnam War. He was awarded several awards: The National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Combat Infantryman Badge and a Bronze Star. He earned the Bronze Star for his bravery there. In a battle, Richard risked his life to refill the ammunition for fellow soldiers under intense gunfire. His Bravo Company Regulars, (3rd Battalion, 22nd Infantry), was awarded a Presidential Unit Citation for Extraordinary Heroism in Military Operations Against an Armed Enemy, at Suoi Tre, Republic of Vietnam, 21 March 1967. After his return from the war, Richard went to Law School and became a Labor Relations Lawyer at the U.S. Dept. of Immigration and Naturalization. He had a long career dealing with labor issues in the U.S. Government.
