

On March 25, 2021 about 31 veterans with our wives, including Don Schulte and myself, traveled to the Missouri National Veterans Memorial in Perryville, Missouri. We were served a buffet dinner at the American Legion before visiting the memorial. This is a permanent full size replica of the wall in Washington, D.C. It was the dream of Jim Eddleman who fought valiantly in the Tet Offensive. Jim made a promise to himself in 1968 that he would one day honor his comrades if he made it out alive. He eventually donated 47 acres of his family's farm to found the memorial in 2017. There are plans to build a reflecting pool, walking trails, playground, statues, seating areas and memorials to veterans of all wars. To date, the memorial contains a Welcome Center, Guardians of Freedom Monument, Military Museum and Honor Flag Memorial.

John Francis Gority—4th Platoon—9/67-10/67

John Gority, 74, passed away April 12, 2021 at UPMC Pinnacle in Harrisburg. He was born in Altoona, son of the late Cecil Hugh and Anna Marie (Kuhn) Gority. John married Donna Lee Dicker on August 25, 1973, in Naples, NY and is survived by his devoted wife and daughters, Shannon Gority and Bridget (Tracy) Peters. John was a 1965 graduate of Bishop Guilfoyle High School. He later received a degree in business administration from Penn State University. He was a disabled Army veteran of the Vietnam War and received a Purple Heart. John was the owner of Broadway Sharpening and Gority Cabinetry for over 35 years. He was Post Commander of VFW Post #3, a member of Catholic War Veterans. American Legion-Gallitzin, Disabled American Veterans, Open Doors for the Handicapped, and served as treasurer for the Blair County Historical Society. John also belonged to the Eastern Amputee Golf Association, Fire Base Eagle and Bravo Company. In his spare time, he enjoyed golfing, fishing, hunting, traveling and woodworking; but especially loved to spend time with his large extended family.
