














# President's Message

# Submitted by M C Toyer (C.O. - 3/70-8/70) - Bravo 3/22 Leads the 25th Division into Cambodia, May 6, 1970

The 3/22nd infantry moved from Tay Ninh up to Thien Ngon en masse the day before the 25th Division operations began. Bravo Company was in the field west of old Crook earlier that day and had to be picked up on short notice and pass through an area salted with CS crystals to reach the Hueys. Thien Ngon, aka old French Fort, had a good runway and we were flown from Tay Ninh in C-130s. FSB Wood was just outside Thien Ngon but had ben abandoned for some time. We moved past the perimeter and into the triple canopy to set up our NDP. There were fresh trenches and several dead NVA so it may have been prepped immediately beforehand. I went back to the Battalion Command Post and met with the CO and staff. I was told to have Bravo ready at 6am and the entire company would go in a single lift of 16 Hueys. I'm not clear if Charlie Company left right before or right after but they were inserted just across the river border to secure that bank for the Mechanized Battalions, Artillery Batteries, and Engineer Bridge Company who were coming overland from Wood.

On May 6th, the 1st Brigade led the 25th Division, the 3/22nd led the Brigade, and Bravo Company led the 3/22nd six klicks into Cambodia at dawn. Our mission was to secure the LZ for Alpha Company, Delta Company, and Echo Company's Recon, Snipers and Mortars, and the Battalion Aid Station. The Battalion Commander and staff were airborne in the C&C. We landed in a clearing just outside the Village of Tasuos and set up a large perimeter spread thin with at least 15 meters between positions. There was not any cover other than a few anthills. My guys were reporting seeing men in black pajamas on bicycles with weapons but we were told to hold our position and not engage. Alpha and Delta passed through our lines and immediately took casualties so pulled back. We would not have artillery support until later that day so called for gunship support then airstrikes with napalm on the village. Bravo Company did not enter the village but worked back to the border the next day to clear the way for the Mech Battalions. They passed through and went elsewhere and I never say them again. For the next three weeks we constantly searched and patrolled. FSB Mini had been established on the VN side of the river crossing with Self Propelled 155m Howitzers and the Engineers. We rotated back there at night for resupply and got mortared but no casualties in Bravo.

That operation was a great success and Bravo Company recovered large caches of weapons and ammunition and supplies of rice and other equipment. A small NVA hospital and two small farming villages were destroyed. A big surprise was finding several sampans on the river, some submerged, and motors on the bank. After our earlier experience in having to evacuate all the enemy material we had recovered, I chose to destroy the boats and motors in place with C-4.

The second phase of Cambodia was to the north in the Fishhook region and the 3/22nd relieved a battalion of the 1st Cav at FSB X-Ray. We continued the search and recover operations for another three weeks. Afterwards the Battalion moved to FSB Kien south of Dau Tieng on the Saigon River.

Hello to all! Hope this finds you in good health. It's been a rough go for many of us for quite a while. The reunion planning has been difficult with so many uncertainties, Covid, plane travels, etc. Even the Elegante Hotel we were to stay at sold to an investor a couple of weeks ago without notice! We have found another hotel that can accommodate us and at the best reasonable rates. The reunion is still on for March 17-22, 2022. Hotel reservations can now be called in to the Radisson Hotel, 1645 North Newport Road, Colorado Springs, CO, 719-597-7000, code name Battle of Suoi Tre. The room cost will be \$147.67 per night, which includes tax. This price includes a complimentary continental breakfast 6-9am and use of their hospitality and banquet rooms. The have a restaurant which serves appetizers and drinks from 4-10pm. They're working on getting the restaurant to open those hours with a full menu. The hotel shares the parking lot with The Airplane restaurant (a fully intact 1953 Boeing KC-97 tanker plane). It has a full lunch and dinner menu, open 11am-9pm, 7 days a week. The hotel has a 24 hour free shuttle to and from the Colorado Springs Airport, just call the front desk with your needs.

The reunion registration fee is \$80.00 per person, which pays for the banquet dinner, cost for tour and transportation to the WWII airplane museum guided tour, snacks and incidentals.

There will be 55th anniversary commemorative t-shirts, polo shirts and zip up hooded sweat-shirts available on a pre order, pre paid basis. We need to know what and how many you want and sizes as the supply chain is questionable. We need to prepay the order. Need to know and pay ASAP! Tees \$20, polos \$25, zip up hooded sweatshirts \$45.

Who would like to take the evening out to Cripple Creek (a historic gold mining town, now gambling casino town. It is still one of the world's leading gold producing mines!) Need to know how many would like to go so I can arrange transportation. Approximate times, leave town 5pm, return 11:30 ish. It's about an hour ride from Colorado Springs through beautiful scenery.

Ft. Carson will have activities for us including the ceremony on the morning of the 21st to honor our fallen brothers. We'll tour their remodeled museum, visit the PX for pins, etc. and have lunch with the troops. We have several speakers at our evening events including past war vets, several of our own men from the different units on the ground at the battle, a couple of our commanders, a couple 911 first responders (as 911 is a parallel to the Pearl Harbor attack on America and what took our current soldiers to the middle east to fight the war on Global Terrorism).

As a special addition, we have a couple of family members of the men who got killed at the Battle and some wives of the recently deceased Suoi Tre vets that will attend also. We want to honor them and let them know they will always be a part of us.

This should be an enriching reunion to all.

Again, wives are encouraged to attend (you have been our support through our dark moments). All activities are geared to be interesting to husbands, wives and family you are invited to bring along.

**Doyle Glenn Poe (1970)** - Doyle Poe (71) passed away on March 20, 2019 in San Antonio, TX. Doyle was born March 11, 1948 in Newport, TN. He is survived by his wife, Annette Poe of San Antonio, TX. Doyle Poe was retired from the U.S. Army after 22 years of service and served three tours in Vietnam, as a volunteer each time. He was awarded the Bronze Star Medal for Heroism in October 1970. He is also retired from the U.S. Postal Service in San Antonio, TX.

Jerry Frank Hadley (Co. Clerk—3-69/70) - Jerry Frank Hadley (72), husband, father and grandfather, passed away on November 24, 2020. He was born August 18, 1948, the son of Frank Gerald Hadley and Cecil Mae House in Water Valley, MS. He attended secondary school in Water Valley, MS and later in Memphis, TN. After graduating high school, Jerry joined the U.S. Army and was later honorably discharged. He was employed by Greyhound as a bus driver for many years, until retirement. Jerry met Barbara Fisk in March of 1996 and they united in marriage in September of 1999. Jerry was a great man who loved to spend time with family and friends. He will truly be missed by all who knew him. He is survived by his wife, Barbara of Kalamazoo, MI.
