Norm flew in over 122 Air Missions in Vietnam, gave many years of his life, sold all of his belongings to take the Traveling Wall around the United States to honor his fellow Veterans and was a huge part of Pointman Ministries for over 25 years. He believed that in Battle, Brothers are born of adversity. Let us stand together and honor this HERO.

It came full circle for Norm. We both experienced a deep healing. It was complete and he had come to peace with his past. The Friday night before Norm died, his 25th Infantry Division from Vietnam had called him from their reunion in Utah. These were the very men he fought with in Vietnam. The last tribute Norm did was for a family in New York, a journalist from the university there, who was the cousin of a young soldier that had died in Norm's arms in Vietnam. This was the source of Norm's pain and trauma that caused him to paint his war experiences. And because of this event, we ministered all over this country to veterans and their friends and families for 25 years. Sunday, July 27, Norm went home to be with his Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. This year and our summer were filled with amazing blessings. A new grandbaby (Joseph), family missions and reunion sendoff, a family wedding, camping with Abigail who loved her Papa, art classes with beloved friends, His Place church family, Norm's great men's Bible study group, his love of the mountains and friends. He was on the church prayer team and literally every week went to the mountains to pray for this valley and as far as he could see—the San Juans, Seattle, Whidbey Island, ... The last day we had together was the most perfect day. Glory!
